Say <u>NO</u> to *graffiti* and <u>YES</u> to *community!*



Enthusiasm about Rockville's future is growing. NOW is the time for you to help to improve downtown!

According to the Vernon Police Department, graffiti vandalism in Rockville is NOT gang-related. It's done by "taggers" who tend to be juveniles seeking recognition from their peers.

As a community, we must care, watch and act! Here are some wise tips:

1. What can you do to prevent "graffiti pollution?"

- Don't participate in it! Respect public and private property. Graffiti is wrong and against the law.
- If you're a parent or guardian, make sure your child is not a graffiti vandal. Teach good morals.
- Don't let your building look trashed! Immediately remove graffiti that appears on your property.
- Make sure that your building exterior is well-lighted throughout the night. Vandals operate under the cover of darkness.
- Assist your neighbors if they need your help in addressing graffiti issues on their property, and ask them to watch your property.
- Call your local utilities (electric, cable, gas, phone company) if you see graffiti on their equipment/boxes, and request removal.
- Proactively work with the Vernon Police Department if you observe graffiti activity or know someone who is a graffiti vandal.

2. What can you do if you're a victim of graffiti?

- DO NOT attempt to apprehend the suspect. DO get a good description of the suspect(s) and vehicle(s) involved, and the location.
- Call 860-872-9126. If the suspects are seen, known, or if there is a witness, request an on-site visit and report. Even if you have no information pertinent to the crime, you still should report the graffiti so police are aware of it.

3. How can you remove graffiti?

- Store and apply matching paint so the graffiti disappears as much as possible.
- Use M.E.K. (Methyl Ethyl Ketone) on glass or previously-painted metal surfaces.
- Wearing rubber gloves, use Graffiti Remover on glass, unpainted metal surfaces, brick or block walls (also scrub w/soap & water)
- If needed, call the Vernon Public Works Department at 860-870-3500 for advice on the best ways to remove graffiti.

4. How can you spot a tagger?

- Paint or marker pen dye stains on hands, under the fingernails, or on clothes.
- Bulky/baggy clothes (military jacket, pull-over or zip-up with a hood, or backpack) to hide spray cans/markers.
- Bloodshot eyes from being out all night tagging and exposure to dangerous toxic fumes from markers/paint.
- Tag names may be written on the underside of the sports cap bill, visor, on notebooks and other possessions.
- Spray paint on sneakers or shoes.
